1. Title of the Practice:

4. The Practice:

Best Practice-2



1. Title of the Practice:

Establishment of the girls' wing of National Cadet Corps in the College.

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- To inculcate the feelings of national integration among the female students of the College.
- To ensure greater participation of the girl students of the College in the task of nation building.
- To ensure gender equity in the NCC unit of the College.

3. The Context:

Till the session 2017-18 only the boys wing was running in the NCC unit of the College and the girls did not get any opportunity to be a part of it. With the establishment of the girls wing of the NCC in the College (3rd COY/66UPBN, NCC, Rae Bareli) the participation of girls in the NCC and the contribution of the female students towards the goal of nation building was adequately ensured from the academic session 2018-19.

4. The Practice:

The 3rd COY/66UPBN NCC Unit of the College has 75 cadets in it who are selected jointly by the In-charge/ANO of the girls' wing of NCC unit of the College and officers of the 66BNUP, NCC, Rae Bareli. The girl cadets regularly participate in various training programmes including the mandatory daily drill and parade at the sports ground of the College and participate to qualify the certificate 'B' and 'C' level examinations of NCC.

5. Evidence of Success:

The motto of NCC 'Unity and Discipline' is clearly perceptible in the turnout, discipline, conduct and joint partnership of girls in all activities of NCC unit of the College.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- Stereotyped patriarchal mindset among families towards the participation of girls in NCC is a challenge to be overcome.
- Permanent lady teachers in the eligible age group who can function as the regular Associated NCC Officers (ANOs) of the girls' wing of NCC are often not willing to take up the responsibility due to their professional and family related compulsions.
